Empty Tote Definition: Prior to returning the IBC, it must be empty in accordance with 40 CFR 261.7

- A. If a container holds an acutely hazardous material (P-listed in 261.31, .31, 32, 33) must be triple rinsed with a solvent capable of removing the acutely hazardous material.
- B. If a IBC contains an (regulated material), it must be DRIP DRY, and in the case of a viscous hazardous waste, IBC may not have more than 0.3% of total capacity by weight of residue remaining.
- C. Caps and labels must be in place and valve closed.

Empty Drum Definition: With regard to most regulated residues, EPA 40 CFR 261.7 says, A container is empty if,

- A. All waste have been removed that can be removed using practices commonly employed to remove materials from that type of container, e.g., pouring, pumping, aspirating, and
- B. No more than 2.5 centimeters (one inch) of residue remain in the bottom of the container "Epa has explained this rule saying "one inch of material is an overriding constraint and may remain in an empty container only if it cannot be removed by normal means. The rationale for this provision is that there are certain tars and other extremely viscous materials that will remain in the container even after the container is emptied by normal means." For residues of products specifically listed by name in 40 CFR 261.33 EPA says the container is empty only" if the container has been triple rinsed using a solvent capable of removing the product, or has been cleaned by other methods shown to achieve equivalent removal."
- DOT's 49 CFR 173.29 says that all opens on the empty container must be closed, and that all markings and labels must be in place as if the drum were full of its original contents. A DOT shipping paper is not required for the transportation of a drum for reconditioning via contract or private motor carrier. DOT placarding is not required for vehicles carrying empty containers for recycling.
